

Benefits of EHRs Electronic health information exchange (HIE) allows doctors, nurses, pharmacists, other health care providers and patients to appropriately access and securely share a patient's vital medical information electronically—improving the speed, quality, safety and cost of patient care. Benefits of Health IT Despite the widespread availability of secure electronic data transfer, most Americans' medical information is stored on paper—in filing cabinets at **Case Studies** various medical offices, or in boxes and folders in patients' homes. When that medical information is shared between providers, it happens by mail, fax or Frequently Asked Questions -most likely-by patients themselves, who frequently carry their records from appointment to appointment. 

What does the HIE Enable?

- ✓ Comprehensive electronic patient information when and where needed
- ✓ Allow physicians to have complete and current information upon which to base clinical decisions
- Test results and imaging results always available eliminating repeat tests/imaging & reducing costs
- Real-time data aggregation to detect patterns (e.g.; bio surveillance) and drive preventative care
- ✓ Quality and payment information derived from record of care not separate reporting systems
- ✓ Patients' empowerment with access to their own health records





Vermont's Unified Health Data Space (UHDS) Model



What Is Vermont's Unified Health Data Space (UHDS)?

- The Unified Health Data Space (**UHDS**) is a collaborative initiative to streamline data services required to improve healthcare in the state of Vermont. Costs and usage of technology will be shared among the participants to avoid duplicative efforts and purchases.
- This Project is an integral part of reform efforts to support a broad spectrum of healthcare stakeholders and uses;
- Point of Care (Providers)
- Quality (ACO Provider Networks)
- Policy Evaluation & Regulation (GMCB, VDH, Blueprint)
- Patients (telehealth, personal health responsibility)
- Population Health (preventative, health equity)
- Once this project is completed it will provide efficient access to needed information to a broad spectrum of important players in the healthcare reform arena. That information includes; Clinical data, Behavioral Health & SUD data, Claims data, and Social Determinants of Health (SDoH) data.


HIE Strategic Plan

- The <u>Health Information Exchange (HIE) Strategic Plan</u> is required by <u>18 V.S.A. § 9351</u>.
 - The purpose of the Plan is to provide a strategy for the implementation of an integrated electronic health information infrastructure for the sharing of electronic health information among health care facilities, health care professionals, public and private payers, and patients.

HIE Steering Committee Charter

- Purpose of the HIE Steering Committee
 - Serve the needs of HIE users by advancing HIE use cases;
 - Strengthen the relationship between authority and accountability; and
 - Engage a broad range of stakeholders in strategic planning and oversight activities.
- Steering Committee's Vision & Mission
 - Vision: To enable health information exchange that promotes quality health care in Vermont.
 - **Mission**: To work across organizations and disciplines to create and endorse a shared view of the definition, purpose, and goals of the HIE in Vermont
- The Steering Committee identified **four overarching goals** in the HIE Plan that are intended to guide the state's health information exchange work.
 - Create One Health Record for Every Person
 - Better Health Outcomes
 - Improve Health Care Operations
 - Use Data to Enable Investment and Policy Decisions
- Ultimately, the Steering Committee exists to support development of a state-wide strategic plan (the HIE Plan) and guide implementation of that plan.


Committee Logistics
